



Create unique ribbon embroideries, with the industry's first ribbon embroidery attachment.









1.	<p><i>Tips & Hints when creating a ribbon design:</i></p> <p><i>When designing with ribbon, use a continuous line where possible, and plan your start and end before placing your design. Ribbon designs cannot be split.</i></p> <p><i>Avoid very sharp corners, and do not use loops smaller than 5mm in diameter.</i></p> <p><i>You can stitch over another ribbon line, but not more than twice.</i></p>	
2.	<p>Add background</p> <p>If you want to add an image to trace, that is easy too. You can choose to add an image from your camera, from computer or create a new one with Draw & Paint.</p>	
3.	<p>Go to the View tab and click on Background Wizard.</p>	




4.	Choose Add New Backgrounds.	 <p>Background</p> <p><input type="radio"/> Load Previously Saved</p> <p><input checked="" type="radio"/> Add New Background</p>
5.	<p>Here you choose which background picture you want to use;</p> <p>Load a picture - Find the picture you want to use in your folders.</p> <p>Paste Picture - If you previously Copied the picture.</p> <p>From Scanner or Camera - Find your source and open picture.</p> <p>Create New Picture - This will open the Draw & Paint module and you can create a new picture.</p> <p>Edit Picture - Will become available when a picture is chosen and you have the possibility to edit.</p>	 <p>Choose Picture</p> <p> Load a Picture</p> <p> Paste Picture</p> <p> From Scanner or Camera</p> <p> Create New Picture</p> <p> Edit Picture</p>
6.	Choose load a picture	 <p> Load a Picture</p>
7.	<p>Use the leaf image provided with the instruction.</p> <p><i>(It is also available as part of the sample files for exercises on the Download page)</i></p>	<p>Optional Downloads</p> <p>Download Explorer-Plug-In</p> <p>Download extended background sets</p> <p>Download USB Driver for direct cable machines</p> <p>Download sample files for exercises</p>

8.	Choose the leaf.	
9.	Step through the Background Wizard until you get to Set Size. Set 200mm	
10.	<p><i>Note that you have to make sure that the image is 40mm smaller than the hoop in width to fit in the restricted area for the Ribbon Embroidery Attachment.</i></p>	
11.	Save as Ribbon Leaf under My Garments	
12.	Now we are ready to use this image as a background for our Ribbon Embroidery. Before we leave the View	

	<p>Tab, lower the opacity of the background image to 50%</p>	
<p>13.</p>	<p>Go to the Embellishment Tab. Zoom in so you get a better view of the image in the hoop.</p>	
<p>14.</p>	<p>Choose Ribbon, Draw Line, Point Line</p>	
<p>15.</p>	<p>In the pop-up, choose a light blue and 5.0mm ribbon size.</p>	
<p>16.</p>	<p>Start clicking in the lower right corner and click all the way around the design. It doesn't have to be perfect, we will edit the points later.</p>	

17.	Right click and Finish placing line.	
18.	Click on Edit points and the design to see the points to edit.	
19.	Take a few minutes to edit your design. You can also Insert or Delete points if needed.	
20.	Click on Properties if you want to Edit the size of ribbon or find out how much ribbon you need for the design.	


<p>21.</p>	<p><i>Now your ribbon embroidery is done! You have created one of the designs used in the campaign. Wasn't that easy!</i></p>	
<p>22.</p>	<p>To save the design click on File and Save As. This will save a .vp4 file that is fully editable again if you want to continue working with it.</p>	
<p>23.</p>	<p>If you want a different format you use the Export instead.</p>	

<p>24.</p>	<p>Here you will get a list of all available formats and you can choose the format you need for your embroidery machine.</p>	
<p>25.</p>	<p>On the Export pop-up you also get additional choices under Optimize for Sewing. These are settings you can change in Configure.</p>	
<p>26.</p>	<p>If you open Configure under the File menu and the Export Tab you can select your options. Removing the checkmarks for Combine and Color Sort helps if you want to decide when to do that manually before Export.</p> <p>This is very useful when working with Appliqué designs where you want to keep the number of color blocks for the technique steps.</p> <p>When you have made the changes click Apply and OK.</p>	

27. Under File and Print, you will get the option to print a template. This is perfect if you want to experiment with the placement or see how the design aligns.

Make sure the Design Scale is set to 100%

You can choose what information you want on your template by checking/unchecking the boxes under Print Information.
