


## Modify Tab



Cut out parts of a design and customize individual stitches




- Select and adjust parts of your embroidery design
- Select a portion of the design and duplicate or delete it


1.	<p>Go to <a href="http://library.mysewnet.com">library.mysewnet.com</a> and search for design 200143005. Click on Send to mySewnet Enable Device and send to the software on your computer. The software will open a new window.</p> <p><i>Note: All designs are part of the Library subscription. If you do not have a subscription you can purchase the design.</i></p>	
2.	<p>In the Hoop Selection pop-up choose 360mm x 260mm Hoop. Orientation Natural. Click OK</p>	
3.	<p>Click on the Modify Tab to edit the design.</p>	

<p>4.</p>	<p>In this exercise will will make a quick and easy edit to create a new combination from parts of this design.</p> <p>To isolate one of the flowers, uncheck the last color.</p> <p>This will make it easier to draw a Freehand Select around the flower we want to use.</p>	 <p>The Design Panel shows the following information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Information: 23953 (with a zigzag icon), 149.1 mm (with a horizontal double-headed arrow icon)</li> <li>4 (with a palette icon), 356.2 mm (with a vertical double-headed arrow icon)</li> <li>Color Select: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1: Purple (checked)</li> <li>2: Brown (checked)</li> <li>3: Black (checked)</li> <li>4: Blue (unchecked)</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<p>5.</p>	<p>Create a line around the flower you want.</p>	 <p>The screenshot shows a design on a grid with four purple flowers and several leaves. <p>6.</p>	<p>Click copt to copy the flower to the Clipboard</p>	 <p>Copy</p>
<p>7.</p>	<p>Go to the Home page and Delete the big design.</p>	 <p>Delete</p>

<p>8.</p>	<p>Paste the small flower.</p> <p>Now we have a “brand new” design we can create something fun with.</p>	
<p>9.</p>	<p>Why not use the Encore feature to create a nice wavy line with 4 repeats.</p>	
<p>10.</p>	<p>Use the squares on the box to change the size and shape.</p>	

<p>11.</p>	<p>Go to the Home page to rote the design to fit the hoop.</p> <p>Use Combine All and Colorsort and there you have a new embroidery design!</p>	
<p>12.</p>	<p>To save the design click on File and Save As. This will save a .vp4 file that is fully editable again if you want to continue working with it.</p>	

<p>13.</p>	<p>If you want a different format you use the Export instead. Here you will get a list of</p>	
<p>14.</p>	<p>Here you will get a list of all available formats and you can choose the format you need for your embroidery machine.</p>	
<p>15.</p>	<p>On the Export pop-up you also get additional choices under Optimize for Sewing. These are settings you can change in Configure.</p>	

<p>16.</p>	<p>If you open Configure under the File menu and the Export Tab you can select your options.          Removing the checkmarks for Combine and Color Sort helps if you want to decide when to do that manually before Export.</p> <p>This is very useful when working with Appliqué designs where you want to keep the number of color blocks for the technique steps.</p> <p>When you have made the changes click Apply and OK.</p>	
<p>17.</p>	<p>Under File and Print, you will get the option to print a template. This is perfect if you want to experiment with the placement or see how the design aligns.</p> <p>Make sure the Design Scale is set to 100%          You can choose what information you want on your template by checking/unchecking the boxes under Print Information.</p>
